Sponsored this year by Thistledown Developments, the Pony Club Mounted Games have been a much-loved part of the show since its introduction in 1957. The idea behind the games was to give children the opportunity to have fun whilst competing without the need for an expensive showing or showjumping horse.

The team of riders representing The North Herefordshire did not have an easy time at the beginning of the week losing out to rivals Oakley Hunt West in the Thistledown Cup held on Wednesday and Thursday afternoon. But in true Pony Club team spirit, the determined young riders pulled it together and made it count when it mattered most.

Astonishingly the team in blue won all but one of the incredibly fought heats, taking place from Thursday afternoon through to Sunday, with a total of six sessions.

A firm crowd favourite, the teams lit up the lively Sunday evening crowd in a display of nailbiting competition. There was just five points in it as they went into the final game – the sack race – but the team hopped over the finish line just in the nick of time.

"It's the best feeling in the world to have won again!" said winning team member Codie. "I'm incredibly lucky to be here back-to-back years and to win here again. Me and Heidi are on our last year here, so it means a lot."

And the secret to their success? Codie says: "We manage to keep our cool; it's not all about ability it's having the mentality as well to stay calm. The ponies love it, the louder the crowd, the faster they go!"
